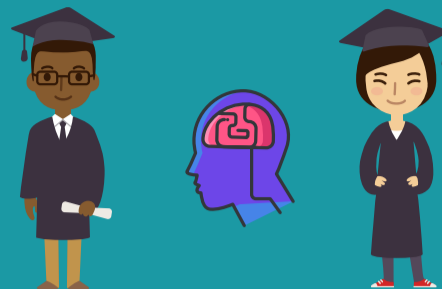


The Top 5 Biggest Trends in Education

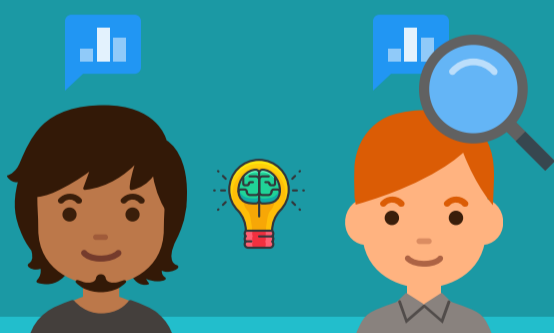


2. Digital Literacy
